



英語教育を通じたSDGsの推進

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
In the IIB English standard course, we use the textbook *SDGs x Discussion* to enhance students' English proficiency while introducing some of the most important issues facing our world today. This dual approach actively supports Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 16 and 17 through lived classroom experiences.

SDG 16: Through thought-provoking discussions centered on human rights, social equity, and the principles of fairness, students begin to understand the complexities of peace and justice. The classroom becomes a microcosm of civic society, where students are encouraged to express their opinions, listen actively, and challenge differing ideas respectfully. In doing so, they build the foundations of strong and just institutions.

SDG 17: Learning doesn't happen in by itself. By working in pairs or small groups, students are exposed to many different viewpoints and problem-solving approaches. This kind of cooperative engagement copies the real-world partnerships needed to solve our global challenges. From local teamwork to global solidarity, students come to appreciate the power of working together toward shared goals.

Students in the IIB English are developing the ability to communicate with empathy, think critically about global issues, and participate meaningfully in a connected world. By taking this course, the EFL classroom turns into a space where language learning meets social responsibility, preparing students to make a difference.
